How can you help?

When we write we have to consider a number of aspects - spelling being one of them.

Encourage your child to have a go at spelling words they are unsure of. This will give them the opportunity to try out spelling strategies and to find those that they find useful. (These are just some spelling strategies your child may use).

Games to play

• <u>phoneme frames</u>	
These help children to segment words e.g	C

		a		†
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• <u>quick - write activities</u>

Say a CVC word and, holding up three fingers, sound-talk it, pointing to a finger at a time for each phoneme. Write the letters of the word in the phoneme frame.

How many words containing the root child can you collect in one minute?

• <u>full circle</u>

Have a set of words and the corresponding letters. Say a word e.g. sat and get your child to make the word with their letters.Keep changing letters to make lots of words and that when they make sat again, they may call out Full circle. The children can sound-talk the words and blend to check they are correct.



Look, say, cover, write, check

Look at the word and say it out loud, then cover it, write it and check to see if it is correct. If not, highlight or <u>underline</u> the incorrect part and repeat the process.
