Numeracy Focus

Measuring Draw or make earthworms of different lengths. Find out which one is the longest and which one is the shortest. Are there any the same length? Try using the words 'longer than', 'shorter than', 'about the same' when comparing your earthworms. Put your earthworms in order starting from the shortest to the longest. Try and find items at home that measure the same length as your earthworms.

Topic: Creatures Big and Small

This week we will think about earthworms. See if you can find out this information: How do earthworms breathe? Where do earthworms like to live? How do earthworms move? What do earthworms eat? What other interesting facts can you find out about earthworms? Did you find any in your garden whilst on your minibeast hunt?

Ongoing ideas to support your Year R child:

Please keep going over the high frequency words in their book bag and the tricky words from last week.

•Introduce the sound 'oo' to your child as in moon, spoon, boom, zoom, root, boot, moo
