Make your own recipe card with a picture of your cake on and list the ingredients you used.

Numeracy Focus

Counting on: Play counting games where you and an adult take turns in counting. For example, you would say the numbers in black and the adult the ones in green and then swap - 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10. You could try 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 or think of a different starting number such as 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10. Draw or make a large number track for outside using the numbers 1 to 10. Play a game where the winner is the first one to get to number 10. Make flashcards of the numbers 1, 2 and 3 and make sure everyone who is playing has their own set. When it is your turn, turn over one of your flashcards and then move that many spaces on the number track you have made using any item as your marker. What can you use to help you count on when it is your next turn? Who won? After having a few goes have a think of how you could change the game.

Celebrate the 75th Anniversary of VE Day on Friday the 8th May with a garden party. Find out what VE Day means and why people are celebrating the occasion.

Ongoing ideas to support your Year R child:
