Using the following letters: s, e, d, a, o, r, b and y, how many words can you come up with? Write them down.

Numeracy Focus – money

Making up groups of money that to 10p (5p, 2p ,2p, 1p etc). Money rubbing using coins. Make a toy shop, create price tags for each item. Invite family members to be your customers. Can you practice adding up amounts in order to come up with the total spent? How much change do they need? Counting money in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s. Mixing coins – what do I need to make 30p? Coin rubbings using crayons and paper.

Topic: Toys

Designing your own toy – using empty cardboard boxes, cover with tin foil and have a go at transforming it into a car. Can you add wheels? Can you come up with a name and number plate for your car? Can you design a flag for the top of the car? How tall can you make your car?
