Laa Columb Killey means ST COLUMBA'S DAY and is the annual fair of Arbory Parish, as Arbory Church is dedicated to St Columba. It was customary that public games and rejoicing followed a service to commemorate the death of St Columba in Iona in 597. This year it will be held on Thursday 27th June on the field opposite the school.

Laa Columb Killey enjoys strong links with Arbory School, the pupils are involved on the day with fancy dress competitions, Manx dancing, taking part in the sports and seeing their creative work displayed

Regulations for Exhibitors

1. ALL EXHIBITS EXCEPT CLASSES C22-26 G1 AND H8-20) MUST BE BROUGHT TO THE EXHIBITION TENT BETWEEN 8am AND 12 NOON ON THURSDAY 27TH JUNE 2019.
2. Exhibits in Classes A3 to A16 inclusive and B1 to C21 inclusive must have been grown by the Exhibitor.
Exhibits in Classes A17 to A22 inclusive must have been in the procession on the Exhibitor for at least two months previous to day of the show
3. No Exhibits may be shown in more than one class.
4. The judges have the right to withhold prizes in cases where the Exhibits do not, in their opinion, merit the prizes offered for them. The judge's decision to be final.
5. All potatoes must be **NAMED AND WASHED** and be 2019 crop.
6. Every care will be taken of Exhibits, but the Committee does not hold itself liable for any loss or damage that may be done to them.
7. All objections must be given in writing, properly signed, to the Exhibition Secretary before 6.00p.m. on the day of the Exhibition.
8. Exhibits should not be removed from the Show Tent before
9. All donated entries in the Confectionery Classes will be sold at 7.00p.m. and all donated entries in the Vegetable Classes will be auctioned at 7.15p.m.
10. All classes are open to Parishioners except G2 (open to ex-pupils of Arbory School only), Class H40 open to all Sunday School scholars.
11. All Classes except A1, 2 10, 27, B1, 2, 6, C3, 5, 9, 21-26, G2, H40 and Arbory School Classes are open to all.
12. All Exhibits must be subject to these regulations.
13. Prize money to be collected on day of show.
14. All Trophies to be collected after 6-30p.m. and to be signed for before removal and returned before 1st June 2020, to the secretary of the Exhibition Committee.
15. Persons exhibiting cars and motorcycles at Laa Columb Killey must be covered by a public liability policy. They agree not to claim against Laa Columb Killey, the landowners, or other bodies or individuals connected with the event in respect of any damage to their property howsoever caused.

6oz/175g Butter/Marg	4oz /125g Plain Flour	2oz/50g Glace Cherries
6oz/175g Caster Sugar	5oz/150g SR Flour	8oz/225g Mixed Dried Fruit
3 Large Eggs	Pinch salt	1 teaspo: mixed spice
		3 Tblspoons marmalade

Method

Preheat oven 150° C/300°F/Gas Mark 2. Grease & line 8" (20cm) round cake tin.
Sieve dry ingredients. Cream butter & sugar until light & fluffy. Beat in eggs one at a time. Fold in dry ingredients, fruit & marmalade. Bake in centre of oven for 1 to 1/2 hours.
