# Laa Columb Killey - Friday 28th June 2024

Please note that school finishes at 12:00. All children must be collected from school on time.

On Friday morning 28 June 2024, the children should come into school as usual at 8:45. At the end of the morning the school will close at 12:00 and may I ask that you make arrangements to collect your children promptly at this time. There will be one bus service running to Ronague and Ballakilpheric which will depart at 11.50am. Children who need to travel in the Castletown direction should catch the 12.08 service bus. A member of staff will wait with them at the bus stop.

If you would like your child to catch the Castletown bus, please advise Mrs Harrison by email by Thursday 27th June.

Fancy Dress - This year's theme is 'Victorians' - judging will take place in the morning at school. Children taking part should wear their costume to school rather than their uniform. Any pre-school children taking part will be judged at 9am.

The afternoon starts at the **Parish Hall at 2.15pm** where we gather for the parade. The Year 6 children will march with the banner leading the school procession from Ballabeg Parish Hall, leaving at 2.30pm. All the children will take part in the procession which is led by Castletown Metropolitan Band followed by the princess and attendants. Please could Year 6 pupils wear their school uniform. Year 6 children involved in the fancy dress competition can wear this instead of school uniform if they would like to. Our Manx dancers will perform after the opening ceremony so these children should come dressed in their Manx dancing costumes.

Please note that the school is officially closed on the afternoon of the 28th but we would appreciate your child being available for the **sports' events from 4:00pm.** This year the children will be taking part in traditional sports and will NOT need to change into P.E. kit. Could you let myself or the class teacher know if your child cannot attend these events. Your child will be given a ticket on the morning of the event, which will enable him/her to gain entrance and is also needed for a free afternoon tea.

The Ceili will begin at 7pm in the Big Tent and is a wonderful event for all ages. Tickets can be bought in advance from the school office, on the LCK website or on the door.

# The Origin of the Festival

The Festival of Laa Columb Killey is a unique part of traditional life in the Parish of Arbory and our school plays an important role in helping to maintain and promote this tradition.

"Laa Columb Killey" means the Day of the Church of Columba, the Patron Saint of Arbory Parish Church. The festival is held as near as possible to the anniversary of the day in which Saint Columba died. It was the custom that on this anniversary day, the service in church should be followed by public games and an opportunity for people to meet with one another and show off home grown produce and crafts and hold exhibitions.

#### **Involvement of Arbory School**

Our children are involved in Laa Columb Killey in several ways including the preparation and presentations of handwriting and art work at school in the weeks leading up to the big day and also for KS2 children in the production of craft work. This work is judged before the day and then presented in one of the display tents for the children and adults to see immediately following the opening ceremony. This is usually a very exciting moment for the children and they look forward in eager anticipation to see if there is a winning ticket attached to their work. The children from school also take part in the school sports events from 4.00pm and these events will have been rehearsed beforehand at school. Each child will take part in a flat race and a novelty race which is organised by each class teacher.

# Involvement of the community in Arbory

There are many competitions for members of the public from all ages to take part in, including growing of produce, art, photography, handicraft, confectionary and floral arrangements. There are also children's sports which take place at 4.00.p.m., an auction of goods at 6.30 p.m. and a school and community Ceili at 7.00.p.m.

## The opening Ceremony

The procession starts at Ballabeg Hall at 2.30pm and is led by Castletown Metropolitan Band and the Laa Columb Killey banner will be carried by Year 6 pupils. On arriving at the field, there are prayers, speeches and it is tradition for the following hymn to be sung:

We thank Thee, Lord, for this fair earth, The glittering sky, the silver sea; For all their beauty, all their worth Their light and glory, come from Thee.

So, while we gaze with thoughtful eye On all the gifts Thy love has given, Help us in Thee to live and die, By Thee to rise from earth to heaven.
